Roles & Responsibilities:

- Facilitate a group of approximately 10 teens in workshops and activities pertaining to agriculture, leadership, and food justice;
- Support program development through generating new curriculum and/or giving feedback on existing curriculum;
- Supervise teens during arrival, meal times and choice activities;
- Assist with daily set-up and clean-up;
- Attend daily staff meetings;
- Work full-time for the duration of the program.

Preferred Qualifications:

- Significant experience working with teens;
- Desire and/or experience working on a farm or in garden settings;
- Ability to plan and implement age-appropriate activities;
- Ability to work both collaboratively and independently;
- Enthusiasm, reliability, creativity, flexibility and patience;
- Excellent communication and interpersonal skills;
- Current certification in standard First Aid and CPR (required).
